

Make your ORCID and Scopus ID work for you

And avoid errors in your publication lists

ORCID is an ID number that you can choose to create. It will distinguish you from others with similar names. It can accommodate name variations and create a full publication list, regardless of where you are employed. ORCID is external, non-profit and internationally recognized.



	<p>Do you have an ORCID? Connect it to your Pure profile: Log in to Pure – (EditProfile) – “Create or connect to your ORCID ID”. You will reach ORCID's website, where you can log in and connect to AU Pure.</p>
	<p>Don't have an ORCID? Create one. Log in to Pure – (Edit Profile) – "Create or connect to your ORCID ID". You will reach ORCID's website, where you can create an ORCID and connect it to AU Pure in the same step.</p>



When you synchronize Pure and ORCID, your publications in Pure will automatically be transferred to your ORCID publication list.

The Scopus ID is your ID in the Scopus database. It is generated automatically if you publish something indexed in Scopus – regardless of whether you have created a Scopus account or not. Hence, there may be errors, but they can be corrected and with an associated ORCID they are reduced. Changes require a Scopus account, which we encourage you to create, but it is voluntary.



	<p>Go to scopus.com and search for your name under “Author”. Check if there are multiple profiles that could be yours (name variations). If you can click on your name, please do so.</p>
	<p>If you can't click on your name, you can search for one of your publications. There may be a title under your unclickable name. Copy it and search for it under documents. In this publication, your author name should be clickable. Then select "view full profile".</p>
	<p>On your Scopus profile, select “Connect to ORCID.” Here you can add your ORCID once you have created a Scopus account.</p>
	<p>If you want to change anything else, you can click “Edit Profile”. If there are publications that are missing or do not belong to you, you can create a change request</p>



Once you have connected your ORCID and Scopus profile, you have improved the chances that the automatic publication import into Pure will run smoothly and that all your publications will be attributed to you.
