

## Overview of Research Services Offered by the Royal Danish Library (KB) to Academic Staff at Aarhus University (AU)

AU Library – a part of the Royal Danish Library – offers a wide range of services for researchers at Aarhus University. These services are often provided either by the department's liaison librarian or by subject specialists, who can offer guidance, for example, in the use of specific research software or data management. PURE: Guidance and support with research registration in PURE, including user access, import/export of publications from PURE systems at other universities,	All
